### MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The fund benchmark, the FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Net Total Return Index, recorded a net total USD return of 8.55% for the month of April 2026. The best performing listed real estate market was Australia, which recorded a total USD return of 14.37% for the month. Japan recorded the lowest total USD return of 3.60%. Year-to-date (YTD) the fund benchmark returned 9.84% in USD. The best performing market was the US (14.26%), whilst Japan (-5.08%) was the worst performing market.

The best performing sectors globally for the month in USD were Single Family Housing (15.11%), Data Centres (13.37%) and Storage (10.43%). The worst performing sectors were Lab Space (-12.26%), Manufactured Housing (1.87%), and Net Lease (6.00%). The best performing sectors globally YTD in USD were Data Centers (38.32%), Net Lease (13.92%) and Storage (13.91%). The worst performing sectors YTD were Lab Space (-15.47%), Student Housing (-9.65%), and Office (-1.65%).

#### UNITED STATES

March payrolls surprised to the upside, with nonfarm employment rising 178,000 following a February decline distorted by strike activity and adverse weather. Wage growth continued to moderate, with average hourly earnings rising 3.5% year-on-year, the slowest pace since 2021, while weaker labour-force participation suggested underlying labour conditions remain softer than the headline payroll print implies.

Inflation, however, has reaccelerated sharply. Headline CPI rose to 3.3% YoY in March from 2.4% in February, driven primarily by surging energy prices following escalating Middle East tensions. Gasoline prices jumped 21.2% during the month, while energy overall accounted for most of the increase in headline inflation. Core CPI remained comparatively contained at 2.6%, indicating that underlying price pressures outside energy remain more stable.

The Federal Reserve left rates unchanged at 3.50%–3.75% in April and signalled increasing concern around inflation risks linked to higher energy costs. Markets have consequently scaled back expectations for rate cuts, with policymakers appearing increasingly inclined to keep policy restrictive for longer as they balance slowing growth against renewed inflation pressure.

#### EUROZONE

Eurozone growth remains sluggish, with first-quarter GDP expanding just 0.1%, underscoring the region's weak industrial backdrop and soft consumer demand. Inflation has nevertheless moved higher again as rising oil and gas prices feed through into headline prices across the bloc.

The European Central Bank kept rates unchanged in April, leaving the deposit rate at 2.00%, while acknowledging rising upside risks to inflation alongside deteriorating growth prospects. Investors who had previously expected additional ECB easing this year are increasingly reassessing that view as policymakers appear willing to look through weaker growth to prevent another inflation resurgence.

#### UNITED KINGDOM

GDP growth remained weak through late 2025, while household demand has been constrained by elevated savings, weak real income growth and still-restrictive financial conditions. Inflation has resumed climbing, with headline CPI rising to 3.3% year-on-year in March. Although core inflation eased modestly, services inflation (closely watched by the Bank of England) remained elevated at 4.5%, highlighting persistent domestic price pressures.

The Bank of England held Bank Rate at 3.75% in March and warned that higher energy and commodity prices are likely to push inflation higher in the near term. Prior to the recent energy shock, markets had expected inflation to move steadily back toward the Bank's 2% target during 2026. That path has now become materially less certain as geopolitical risks increasingly dominate the inflation outlook.

The estimated forward funds available for distribution (FAD) yield for the global real estate sector is 4.88% with a 4-year annual compound FAD growth of 6.26%, in USD.

### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

This specialist fund offers real estate focus, with global diversification. The real estate focus is through real estate securities with a specific bias towards stocks classified as investors, as opposed to developers. The investor classification is defined as those stocks that have 70% or more of their income derived from rent. The guiding principle is the ownership of real estate assets, primarily to earn rental related income streams which provide a stable underpin to long term returns. Global diversification is across geographic regions, currencies, countries and real estate types. The intention is to provide an attractive risk-adjusted return to form part of a multi asset class portfolio. The fund benchmark is the FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Index, which comprises of stocks in the following regions: United States, Canada, UK, Europe, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia and New Zealand.

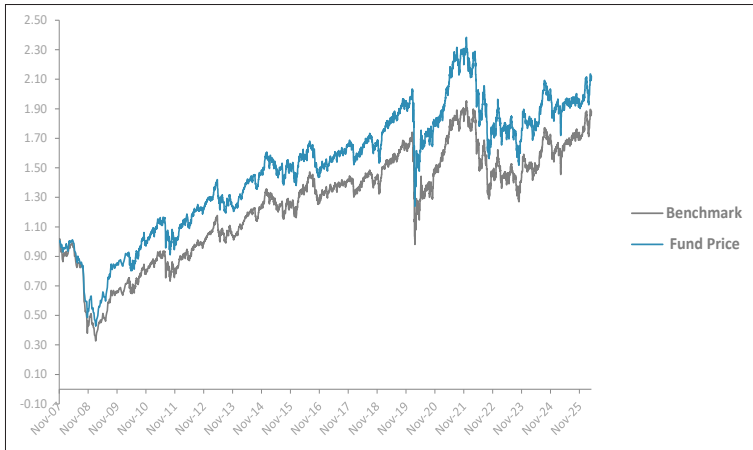

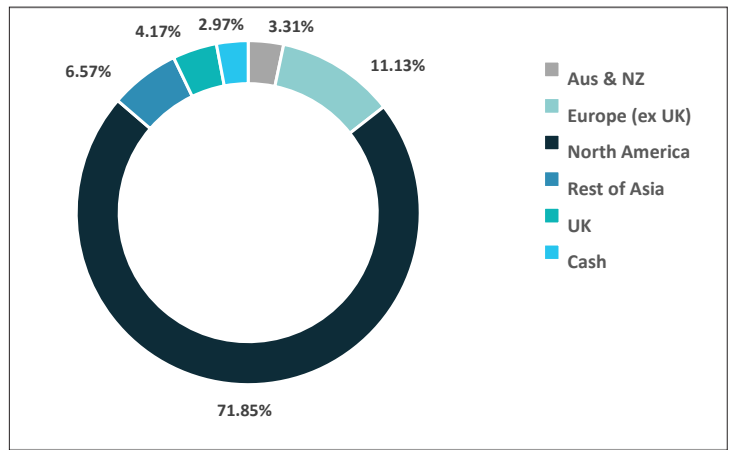

#### GEOGRAPHIC ALLOCATION AS AT 30 APRIL 2026



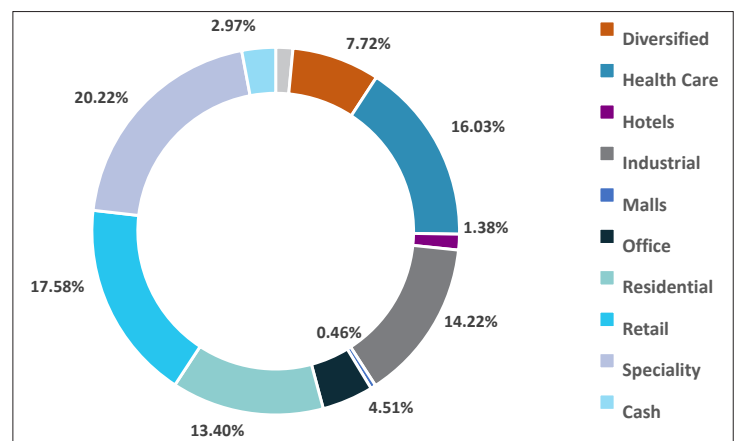
